**Charles Gabriel Seligman** (1873-1940), M.D.: ritual prophylaxis in Sri Lanka, 1907-8: **Dr W. L. Hildburgh** (1876-1956) Sri Lankan fertility rites, representations of sickness-afflicting devils, devil-possession, and cure of variously afflicted persons, 1903-4: **Professor I. Schapera**, magician and rainmaker of Kgatla tribe, Botswana, making and using medicines, c.1920-1930; **Grubb:** Aguarunas man in traditional costume, with dark discolouring on chest, symptom of a skin disease common among Aguarunas, 1923-39: **Thurston:** sacred rock, scratched for applying to forehead as cure for headache, Southern India, pre-1906 **Williamson:** two Papua New Guinean women wearing illness recovery capes, 1910 **Melville William Hilton-Simpson:** medicine and surgery in Algeria, incl Shawia doctors using herbal medicines, bleeding patient, treating wounds in the street and setting broken bones with a variety of splints; drug-sellers; patients treated by Shawia doctors, with dressed wounds and legs in splints, scars resulting from medical treatment incl removal of bones from leg and arm, and trepanned head, 1914-20: **Miller:** Fulani boy with distended navel, common in Nigeria, Katsina province, 1930s
